## **Our Parks, Their Homes**

## **Our Parks, Their Homes**

This year's Fund-A-Need appeal is particularly key. Science and research projects such as glacial monitoring and wildlife restoration are woefully underfunded and vitally important. The parks are home to countless wildlife. Guests will be encouraged to give a tax-deductible contribution to help strengthen our parks, which are their homes.

One example is a proposed project in Olympic National Park called "After The Dams Are Gone." The removal of two dams from Washington's Elwha River beginning in 2011 set the stage for the largest dam removal project and one of the largest restoration projects ever undertaken in the United States. Funding will create a program to study wildlife returning to the area of the Glines Canyon lakebed. Scientists will study the impact that animals such as elk and mule deer have on the return of native plants. This high priority research project is vitally needed in the Elwha River area but sadly, isn't funded. As the requesting scientist wrote in the proposal, "This research needs to be done soon or we will lose the opportunity forever."

Annually, superintendents of the Mount Rainier, North Cascades and Olympic National Parks submit lists of priority park projects that, except for charitable contributions, will not otherwise happen. Over the past seven years, more than \$3 million has been contributed to the parks through Washington's National Park Fund.

100% of the donations given to Washington's National Park Fund stay right here in Washington State for the benefit of Mount Rainier, North Cascades, and Olympic National Parks.
