

WASHINGTON'S NATIONAL PARK FUND MOURNS THE LOSS OF CO-FOUNDER AND FORMER WASHINGTON GOVERNOR AND SENATOR DAN EVANS

SEATTLE (September 22, 2024) – Washington's National Park Fund (WNPF), the official philanthropic partner serving Mount Rainier, North Cascades, and Olympic National Parks, was deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Daniel J. Evans on September 20.

Evans ranks as one of the most distinguished leaders in the history of the State of Washington. Perhaps best known for serving as governor from 1965–1977, he has demonstrated a lifelong commitment to public service and began his political career in the Washington State House of Representatives in 1956.

Evans summitted Silver Peak in the Cascades at the age of 12, and held an appreciation for wilderness. He leaves an enduring legacy in the national parks of Washington state, having co-founded WNPF alongside former Governor and Senator Dan Evans and other prominent community leaders in 1993.

Thanks to these pioneers' dedication to preserving Washington's national parks more than thirty years ago, WNPF has grown over the years, distributing more than \$7.5 million in the last decade – including a record \$1.5 million to the parks earlier this year.

"Dan Evans was passionate about Washington's public lands and remained involved as an Honorary Board Member and friend of the Fund until his passing," said Alex Day, Interim Chief Executive Officer for WNPF. "He will be deeply missed by WNPF and our community."
