Accomplishments Washington's National Park Fund has awarded more than \$10 million to Mount

Rainier, North Cascades, and Olympic National Parks. We are the only

raise help fund 30-40 park projects annually.

We work closely with the superintendent and staff at each park, who determine the priority projects most in need of philanthropic support. Projects fall into four core areas: science and research, visitors' experiences, volunteerism and stewardship,

With the help of thousands of individual and corporate supporters and foundations, we have funded critical search and rescue equipment, countless miles of trail maintenance, wildlife studies, meadow restoration teams, invasive

species removal, glacier studies, and many other projects.
